St. Anne's College — 2022 Summer Session

— THE PROGRAM —

On one of Oxford's oldest summer study programs, you will live and study at St. Anne's College in the University of Oxford.

As you follow the English system, which combines daily lectures and weekly tutorials, you will learn about the literature, history and society of late-16th and early-17th-century England—the Elizabethan, Jacobean and Caroline periods. Lecturers include some of the world's foremost experts on English Renaissance history and literature. Tutorials are conducted by professors from Oxford and other British universities, and each tutorial group usually consists of three students, allowing for considerable individual attention and participation.

— DATES —

Six weeks from June 27-August 6, 2022

Application Deadline: February 15, 2022

The possibility of a second summer conducting independent research available to qualified students.

— COST —

Approximately \$7,900. Some financial aid is available, and federal grants and loans may be applied.

This fee includes full tuition; a single room; all meals; group excursions including theatrical productions in London and Stratford-upon-Avon; access to the Bodleian Library; and course credits. (Not included is the cost of transportation, passports and incidental expenses.) Upon successful completion of the program, the student will be awarded 3 semester hours in history and 3 semester hours in literature.

Students from all years and majors are encouraged to apply.
