



Jacob Bushong's "Pennsylvania" style barn features a ramped entrance and threshing floor space that extended over the lower level stalls. The barn was struck by lightning and burned on July 6, 1939. It was rebuilt on the original foundation in 1942

...all the barns were burned last fall and nearly everything else in the eating line destroyed. Your father's barn was not burned...

After the battle, Jacob Bushong's 1830s barn became a field hospital for both Union and Confederate soldiers.

This is the first re-siding of the barn in over 70 years. Deterioration is severe. Each board costs \$15 to purchase and install.
